WHEREAS, each year approximately 3,400 North Dakotans are diagnosed with a new cancer; and

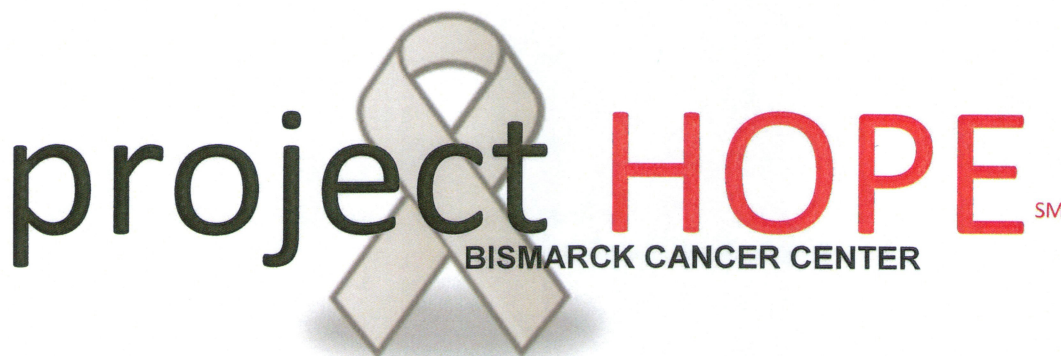
WHEREAS, the top four cancer sites are lung, colorectal, breast, and prostate, and they account for 56% of cancer cases in North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, it is the Bismarck Cancer Center's hope to help in the healing of everyone affected by cancer; and the mission of the Bismarck Cancer Center Foundation is to contribute to the care of the "whole" patient and ease the burden and stress of cancer within our community; and

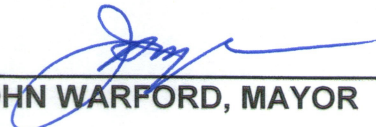
